# Paperwork, CBR Application & Food Handler Card

Summer is almost over and all necessary forms and paperwork need to be completed prior to school starting. To help us be ready, please return your completed forms via mail or drop them off at school by August 23rd. Most information must be complete before your child attends class—specifically the Information and Authorization Form and Immunization record.



You'll want to take your time filling out the paperwork to make sure all of the information is correct. Some forms are double sided, so don't miss the back! If you are a returning student, you need to complete new forms and update any changes. Immunizations may be filled out by a parent. See link for the state certificate. Immunization Form.

#### **IMPORTANT - GET YOUR CBR Number**

If you have selected to parent help in the classroom on a monthly basis and receive a reduction in tuition, you must be on the Central Background Registry and get a CBR #. We recommend both parents choose to do so. You can apply online, or print out the form and mail it in. It costs \$35.00 and is good for five years. You will be asked to have your fingerprints taken. After your application is submitted they will send you the location to get your fingerprints done. It is typically a little "mail center" just around the corner, and is done very quickly with a little machine.

Questions? If you follow the link, the Oregon state website will share all the info with you. One benefit to getting your CBR number is it can be used when you volunteer in Public School, sports teams, and many other activities that you may end up doing with your child!

#### Food Handler Card

Everyone who plans to parent help with the children at CCC is required to have a food handlers card. You can get yours by watching a quick video **here** from the State. It costs \$10.00 and is good for three years. If you already hold valid a food handlers card, please bring a copy of your certificate to the office or scan and email it to <a href="mailto:info@creativechildrenscenter.com">info@creativechildrenscenter.com</a>.



#### Orientation Information

Orientation will be held on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>August 29th at 6:00 pm</u> at <u>Griffith Park Building</u>. *All families* are asked to attend. One parent from each family is required to come. Welcomes and sign ups will begin at 6:00 with orientation at 6:20.

This is a special event for the adults, **so we ask that children be kept at home**. Orientation is a time when new and returning families come together to share our value as a community of learners, big and small! We will introduce ourselves and go over the key elements of our program, including CCC's history, educational philosophy, our image of a child, and our view of cooperative education. We will learn about the school day and what it means to be assist in the classroom. With images and stories, these and other big ideas will be addressed at Orientation. #### Questions or Ideas

We love hearing from parents! Please don't hesitate to send us an email or set up a time to chat. Research shows the face to face is the best way to communicate, followed by phone, then by email or text. Keep in mind that pick up and drop off times are very busy, and teachers have the their eyes and ears on the whole group. This is a good time to ask them if you can check in with them in 15 minutes after class, or to give you a call when their day is done. We appreciate communication and

## First Week of School September 5-14th - Students Begin

September 5th through the 7th will be the first days of school for the children. In an effort to get to know the children and to assist with potential separation issues, parents are encouraged to spend the first day with us. #### Parking Information

CCC has a front and back lot, as well as street parking behind the school off Bryant Street. The first week we will stagger arrival times to smooth the transition. Be aware that parking spots are at a premium so be be timely with your "goodbyes." If you plan on staying for the day, consider parking on Bryant Street and entering through the back neighborhood. When driving to the backlot, take it slow, and wait for others to pull out before pulling all the way in. Be sure to be on time for pickup so teachers and parent helpers can clean up timely. Want to chat with the teacher about the day or check in with the office? It is best to email first and we can plan on setting aside some time before or after class.

### Sept 8th - Saturday Work Party - 9 to 12

We invite you to join the staff in caring for our grounds and classrooms. This is a great way to get to know your teacher and other parents. Our first work party of the year is set for Saturday, Sept. 7th from 9:00 am to noon. It is a wonderful gift to give our teachers as we embark on a new year! Classrooms will be cleaned from top to bottom, furniture will be polished, and everything will sparkle before the morning is over.

Families are asked to participate in two of the five work parties scheduled throughout the year or opt out for a fee. If you would prefer to opt out, you can



contact the office. Additional work party dates can be found on the academic calendar. In order for us to complete the work in a timely manner and for safety reasons, we ask that no children attend.

#### Early Birds & Creativity Club

If you need Early Bird care, we will have a teacher at CCC starting at 7:30. The teacher will welcome your child to school and assist them in transitioning to their classroom at the beginning of the day.
